New Student Info for Baldwin

Uniforms

The uniform guidelines of the school coincide with MPS dress code, but in a more detailed and school-specific form: The Baldwin Dress Code is as follows:

Uniform Tops

Girls: Dark purple or white polo shirts; short or long sleeved, may have a banded waist. White button-down shirts; ¾ length sleeve, short sleeve, or long sleeved.

*All shirts must have collars, and no logos, unless it is the Baldwin logo.

Boys: Dark purple or white polo shirts; short of long sleeved White button-down shirts; short or long sleeved.

*All shirts must have collars, and no logos, unless it is the Baldwin logo.

*Shirts do not have to be tucked in, but if student chooses to tuck in shirt, a belt must be worn, if pants, shorts, or skirts have belt loops.

Uniform Bottoms

Girls: KHAKI or BLACK shorts, skorts, that look like skirts from the front and back, skirts, jumpers (all must adhere to MPS policy requiring these to be no higher than 2 inches from the crease in the back of the knee), capri pants, or long pants. All pants must be regular cut, with no "skinny pants" or leggings made to look like pants. PLAID (color "2M") skorts that look like skirts from the front and back, skirts, and jumpers may be worn also.

Boys: KHAKI or BLACK shorts and long pants. Pants must fit properly and may not sag. *No athletic shorts.

<u>Purses, Totes, and/or Bags:</u> Students may carry small purses to transport personal items; however, purses may be no larger than "10 x 8 x 2". Students may not carry backpack purses. <u>Shoes:</u> Shoes must cover the foot. Athletic shoes are preferred. Shoes such as loafer, flats, "boat shoes" are permissible, as long as they cover the foot. Boots made to wear during inclement weather (such as rubber rain boots) may be worn to school; however, they must be stored in the student's locker during the day. No bedroom slippers, flip-flops, stilettos or slides will be allowed.

<u>Outerwear:</u> White, dark purple, dark/light gray or black sweaters (crewneck & V-neck), sweater vests, sweatshirts, zip front hoodies, and fleece jackets are all acceptable. Outerwear must be solid in color with no logos. No branded outwear can worn in the classroom. All may be embroidered with the Baldwin logo, but school logos are not required.

*Outerwear MAY NOT BE monogrammed with the student's personal name.

Hats and scarves are considered outerwear and must be placed in the student's locker during the school day.

Socks/Tights, Ties, Hair Ribbons, Belts, Accessories:

Socks and tights: solid color white, black, or flesh colored. Dance students may not wear their dance class tights under skirts.

Ties may be worn (must be tied correctly) but are not required: solid dark purple or plaid (2M).

Hair Ribbons and small hair bows should be solid color: black, white, purple, beige/khaki, or plaid (2M). No large hairbows may be worn. Headbands may be worn to hold back the wearer's hair but may not be worn on the forehead. Large jewelry, such as necklaces or earrings, is not allowed.

Belts, if worn, must be solid black, brown, or purple.

<u>Special Occasions</u>: On special occasions, designated by the Principal, students may wear Baldwin t-shirts that have not been altered to look different than intended. (no cut sleeves, slits, tassels, etc.). On these special days, students must wear uniform bottoms.

PE Uniforms: students taking PE (which is all students except for Dance students) will purchase PE uniforms from the PE teachers during the first few weeks of school. Each item is \$7, so a full set is \$14. PARENT TIP: It is recommended that parents purchase more than one full set of gym clothes. Students alternate their gym clothes throughout the week to minimize the odor that sets in to their gym clothes. Students may also lose items throughout the year, so it is good to have a fallback uniform. Students are also required to wear white tube socks as part of their gym uniform. It is recommended that you purchase multiple pairs of socks as well. Tennis shoes must be worn in PE. Students who fail to bring the required uniform are given the option to borrow items from the lost and found pile or take a reduction in grade for dressing out that week. PARENT TIP: Some students bring 2-3 uniforms with them to school on Monday morning. They alternate throughout the week and bring them home Friday to be washed. Find a system that works for your family and stick with it!

Lockers

Students will rent a locker near their homeroom class from their homeroom teacher during the first two weeks of school. The **rental fee is \$7** for the school year. Upon payment, students will be given the combination for their locker. It is a good idea to have your student practice using a 3-digit combination lock over the summer, so they are prepared.

Locker Decorations: No decorations may be permanent and must not be visible from outside the locker. Students typically use magnetic mirrors, hooks, shelves, or dry erase boards in their lockers. (It is recommended that you don't purchase locker decorations until you know the size of your locker.)

PE Students must also **rent a P.E. locker for \$5**. These lockers have the same type of 3-digit combination. Students can store their PE uniforms, shoes, extra deodorant or hygiene items in these lockers.

Lunch/Breakfast

Baldwin students will receive free breakfast and lunch again this year. Students arriving early for breakfast will enter through the gym at 6:30 (if car rider) and proceed to the cafeteria. Bus riders will be dropped off at the Scott Street door. Students eat lunch during their 5th period class during one of three waves.

Arrival/Dismissal:

The school day begins at 7:12 and ends at 2:15 at Baldwin. Students are permitted into the building through the gym beginning at 6:30 AM. The front door opens approximately at 7:00 AM. There is a warning bell at 7:10 AM. The tardy bell rings at 7:12 AM, so students should plan for enough time to go through security, go to their locker, and make it to homeroom before the tardy bell rings. Students must be seated in their desk in homeroom to be considered on time. Students must be signed in in the office by a parent if they arrive at school after the tardy bell rings.

The dismissal bell rings at 2:15. Students exit the front doors, gym doors, and bus riders use the Scott Street doors for their exit.

McDonough is a ONE-WAY street. During arrival and dismissal times, the left lane becomes a line for drop off and pickup. It is recommended that students sit in the back-driver side seat of the vehicle so that they can disembark safely. Many parents park in metered parking spots around the school on McDonough and Lawrence and allow their students to walk safely to and from the school. Do NOT let students out or park on Scott Street next to the school; **this is the bus lane**. Baldwin has a crossing guard stationed at the corner of McDonough and Scott Street. Students should use the crosswalk at all times for their safety. Do not let students get out of the vehicle if not next to the curb. It is not safe.

School Supplies

At new student orientation, students will be given a list of required/recommended school supplies per classroom. The first few days of school students only need a notebook, some paper, and a pen/pencil. If you're shopping the Back to School sales, these items may be needed during their time at Baldwin:

Faculty Follies, in October, is an incredible talent show provided by the faculty and staff at Baldwin. The event coincides with a dance, and discounted combo tickets will go on sale ahead of time.

Magnet High School Showcase, in January, principals and faculty from the magnet high schools will be available for parents and students to answer questions as they prepare for high school. Baldwin Run, in February, will be our largest fundraiser of the year. Students will receive pledges and donations and will compete for prizes in an effort to raise \$10,000 for our school. Dances: there are 4 dances throughout the year, in August, October, February and May. Check the calendar for dates. Dances are from 6:30-9:00 PM. Tickets are sold at the door and admission is \$10, except for the Faculty Follies Dance, when we offer a discounted combo ticket for both Follies and the Dance. These combo tickets will go on sale the week before Faculty Follies.

Nancy's Italian Ice will be sold again this year after school on Thursdays for \$2. The PTSA keeps a portion of the proceeds and uses them for the betterment of our school.
